Glasgow HHH Commonwealth Hash 2014 Weekend

18 – 20 July 2014

GH3 increase capacity due to worldwide demand.

In response to an influx of registrations for the Commonwealth Hash weekend 2014 Glasgow Hash House Harriers announces a 20% increase in spaces.

In 2014 Glasgow will host the 20th Commonwealth Games and coincidentally GH3 will host the 2014 Commie Hash event. It is traditional that every four years there is a Commie weekend and it traditionally is hosted – coincidentally – by a pack near the Commonwealth Games host city. The Glasgow event will be held on the weekend of 18 – 20 July 2014 and will be centred on the city with trails taking place in and out of town.

A week of Celtic pre-rambles

Whilst this weekend is a stand alone event, it is being held a week before the Brussels Beer Odyssey making it one of the major pre – rambles to the big European HHH party next year.

Dublin and Belfast hashes have now announced their Guinness and Titanic pre rambles to Brussels making the Glasgow event the start of a Pan Celtic **Snail Trail to Brussels**.

There are excellent transport links between Glasgow and Belfast / Dublin.

Worldwide exposure

The quadrennial Commonwealth Hash is one of the few regular worldwide HHH events. To date Glasgow Commie Hash has attracted hashes from 54 packs.

Some 43% of those attending are from hashes outside of Europe.

20% increase in Capacity

The Glasgow event has been receiving registrations at over ten a week meaning that its original capacity of 110 has been surpassed. In response to this demand the event mismanagement have announced a 20% increase in capacity to 135. Please note, the mismanagement are keen to ensure that the event quality and community sprit are not eroded, and no further increase is planned.
